
The Project-Based Research Cycle

Which stage of the diagnosis → prescription → implementation → evaluation cycle is each group at? Assume each group has done no research at any of the prior stages. How may research at those earlier stages have improved their practice?

- •A community organization is interested in whether its midnight basketball program has reduced the crime rate in its community.
- •A community organization believes the city bus service discriminates against the people in their community by providing less service than it does to other communities. They are putting a policy proposal together to change the routes.
- •An ethnic neighborhood believes their ethnic history is being forgotten by their youth, and are starting a program to have their youth video interview neighborhood elders.
- •A public health organization wants to know how individual lifestyle behaviors are impacting the incidence of diabetes in a poor community.
